**WHAT'S NEW WITH BCFP**

At our January 2024 meeting, the Board voted to acquire three easements from our Fiscal Year 2025 funding pool, totaling over 230 acres. We are also working to close a full easement donation of 100 acres this year. The Board has one more easement to close from 2023.

Our spring monitoring season is in full swing. We love visiting all of our unique properties. We have even gotten to see EMU on a farm this year! The diversity

of agriculture in our county is a beautiful thing, and we hope to continue to see it grow.



- NEW APPLICATION DEADLINE! Applications will only be accepted until  
 \* 30 SEPTEMBER
- We will begin accepting applications for the next year in June.
- The only signs allowed on Easements, including temporary signs, are those advertising a farm business or activity, no trespassing signs, or a for sale sign. There are also size restrictions so please review your Deed or feel free to ask for clarification.
- Dumping or storage of trash is prohibited under the Deed of Conservation Easement.
